FROM THE DEAN

As we celebrate the Season of Epiphany - the entry into a New Year - we celebrate the gift of discovery, of seeing things in a new light which began with the wise people following a star until they found the Christ child, the source of the light for the world.

Last week we heard Philip's invitation to Nathanael to 'come and see' Jesus. We too are invited to come and see, to reflect on what we would like to see. What gifts we would like to bring to what we find, both as individuals and together, as we kneel beside that hope. What do we imagine would add to the peace and love of the world as a sign that Christ has come and is with us?

I believe that we need to begin right here in our congregation for even tiny signs of the presence of Christ here in our midst and in ordinary places among ordinary people like us, rather than in some grand and powerful place. What is your favourite thing about the life we share in this faith community? I invite each of you to come on Sunday 21 February at 12pm for a light lunch and then a discussion and planning session around the theme of 'come and see'. We will then be able to set some priorities that are related to our Strategic Plan that will enable us to work toward bringing 'the light of Christ' to the world.


